<u>BIO</u>

My practice is driven by a desire to understand the embodied subject. It is a practice that places the materials and processes of painting in dialogue with post-structuralist and deconstructive thinking, phenomenology of the body, queer theory, psychoanalysis, and medical history.

Central to my practice is a philosophical and psychoanalytical interest, which often manifests itself in paintings that directly comment on textual references. I am drawn to theories on the processes that shape a subject, and explore ways in which painting can reflect these theories by acting as a mirror of or stand-in for the embodied subject.

Since a few years, my work has evolved in dialogue with Julia Kristeva's theories on the abject. The abject is the indefinable that lies between being subject and object; that which arouses discomfort because we are not given the opportunity to categorize it. Consequently, abjection is the process by which something is rejected or cast out, as it is felt to threaten our idea of a whole and pure self. The abject thus concerns boundaries between subject and object, inside and outside, self and other - and simultaneously stresses both a blurring and an establishment of these boundaries. It is a concept through which we are confronted with the materiality of our self.

Through my work I have investigated how these ideas on the abject can be filtered through and placed in relation to painting. It examines representation and identification; processes of subject-makings of objects and object-makings of subjects; materialities and boundaries; and tensions between a violent distancing (disgust) and a seductive attraction (desire).

Rebecca Lindsmyr (b. 1990) is an artist currently based between Malmö, Sweden, and New York, United States. She graduated with a *Master in Fine Art* from Malmö Art Academy (SE) in 2021, and previously holds a *BA (Hons) Fine Art: Painting and Printmaking* from Glasgow School of Art (UK). Apart from her Fine Arts degrees she has received 135 etcs credits in a combination of Gender Studies, History, Art History, The Intellectual History of Ideas, Philosophy and Cultural Studies - from courses relating to the understandings and representations of bodies and subjects.

In 2021 Lindsmyr received the Assistant Grant from The Swedish Arts Grants Committee (SE), to work for the Danish artist Lea Porsager. In 2022 she received the Ellen Trotzig Grant from Malmö Art Museum (SE), as well as the Anne-Marie Hökerberg-Hecht Foundation Grant from The Royal Swedish Academy of Fine Arts (SE) which includes spending 6 months as a resident at Cité Internationale des Arts in Paris in 2023. Since 2022 she is represented by Nils Staerk in Copenhagen (DK), where she held her first solo exhibition in 2022.
